

Frequently Asked Questions: APPLYING FOR A DISABILITY PARKING PERMIT

Where do I apply for a Disabled Parking Permit? You apply at the Town/Village/City Clerk's office of the locality that is your permanent residence (determined by where you are registered to vote)

Where do I obtain the form MV-664.1 Application for a Parking Permit for persons with severe disabilities? You can pick one up at the Town Clerk's office; download the form from <http://www.dmv.ny.gov/forms.htm#mv6641>, or your physician's office.

How long is the Temporary Disability Parking Permit valid for? A Temporary (red) Disability Parking Permit is valid up to six months regardless of expected recovery date. A new application must be submitted each time it needs to be extended.

What type of disability is eligible for a Temporary Disability Parking Permit? A person with a temporary disability is any person who is temporarily unable to ambulate without the aid of an assisting device. Examples of an assisting device include, but are not limited to, a brace, cane, crutch, prosthetic device, another person, wheelchair or walker.

Who can certify a Temporary Disability Parking Permit? Only a Medical Doctor or Doctor of Osteopathy can certify a Temporary Disability Parking permit.

How long is a Permanent Disability Parking Permit Valid for? A Permanent (blue) Disability Parking Permit is valid for three years. (Can differ by municipality)

What type of disability is eligible for a Permanent Disability Permit? A Permanent Disability Permit is issued to a person who has a "severe" disability with one or more of these permanent impairments, disabilities or conditions which limit mobility: uses portable oxygen, legally blind, limited or no use of one or both legs, unable to walk 200 ft. without stopping, neuromuscular dysfunction that severely limits mobility, Class III or IV cardiac condition, restricted by lung disease, physical or mental impairment or condition...which imposes unusual hardship in the use of public transportation and prevents the person from getting around without great difficulty.

Who can certify a Permanent Disability Parking Permit? Permanent Disabilities may be certified by a Medical Doctor (MD), Doctor of Osteopathy (DO), Physician Assistant (PA), Nurse Practitioner (NP), a Doctor of Podiatric Medicine (DPM, for disabilities related to the foot) or Optometrist (OD, for blindness).

How do I renew my Temporary Disability Parking Permit? Have your Medical Doctor or Doctor of Osteopathy complete a new form MV-664.1 Application for a Parking Permit for Persons with Severe Disabilities and submitted to the Town Clerk's office.

How do I renew my Permanent Disability Parking Permit? Return your expired Permanent Parking Permit to the Town Clerk's office and they will issue a new one.

How many Temporary/Permanent Disability Parking Permits can I have? Only one permit will be issued to an applicant, as the permit is issued to a person and can move with to any vehicle that you are traveling in.

What documents are required to apply for a Temporary/Permanent Disability Parking Permit? You will need a completed MV-664.1 Application for a Parking Permit for Persons with Severe Disabilities, your driver's license or a Non-driver's Photo Identification.

What is my Disability Parking Permit is lost or stolen? Obtain a form from the Town Clerk or your Local Police Department, file the report with the police department and return a copy to the Town Clerk, who will issue a replacement.

What is the cost for a Temporary/Permanent Disability Parking Permit? There is no charge for a Disability Parking Permit.
