April 5: at 7 p.m. Kenneth Brand and his sister Leslie Tollner will present a program on the **Elm Rest House** in Oak Hill which was established and run by their grandmother Hattie Field from 1918 until 1963 when it was purchased by Mary Parks. Arlene Brown met her husband there; Janet Hull, Claudia Every, Janice Bowdish, Patti Fetty and so many others were employees. Come and share your memories or to hear this wonderful story.

April 12: Homesteading 7 p.m. Seed exchange. Bring seeds you have saved or purchased. Jane Hershey will explain how to save seeds for the future, how to select fruit to save the seeds from, the meaning of terms such as hybrid, open pollinated, certified organic, heirloom. She will introduce us to local seed companies. You do not have to bring seeds to participate.

April 19: Craft Group 7 p.m. Stitch and Chat. Bring your projects and relax with other crafters while you work. If you have questions about your project, likely someone can answer them. The details of the crime are slow to surface because she is traumatized and reluctant to relive or reveal what happened either to the police or to her husband and thirteen-year-old son. In one day, everyone's life is irrevocably transformed.
